MEMORANDUM

RE; County Officials' Salaries FY 94-95

The 98th General Assembly, in its 1993 session, adopted Public Chapter No. 804, which amended Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 8, Chapter 24, relative to an increase in county officials' salaries for fiscal year 1994-95. Section 1 (b) of that chapter states:

Effective July 1, 1994, all county officials whose compensation is determined by the provisions of this part shall receive a compensation increase equal to the average annualized percentage increase received generally by state employees during fiscal year 1993-94 pursuant to the terms of general compensation increases provided by the General Appropriation Act. On or before May 1, 1994, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration shall certify to the Comptroller of the Treasury the percentage of such increase.

Attached is a letter from Richard V. Norment, Assistant to the Comptroller for County Audit, acknowledging that the Commissioner of Finance and Administration has certified to the Comptroller of the Treasury a salary increase for county officials of 6.08 percent. Also included are schedules of the budgetary salary for the Fiscal Year July 1, 1994 through June 30, 1995. Please remember that Public Chapter 1035 of the Public Acts of 1990 abolished the minimum salary law.

SUBJECT: County Officials Salary Increase Effective July 1, 1994

In accordance with provisions of Chapter 460, Public Acts of 1993, all county officials whose salary is determined by Title 8, Chapter 24, Part 1, shall receive an increase effective July 1, 1994 "equal to the average annualized percentage increase received generally by state employees during fiscal year 1993-94 pursuant to the terms of general compensation increases provided by the General Appropriation Act. On or before May 1, 1994, the Commissioner of Finance and Administration shall certify to the Comptroller of the Treasury the percentage of such increase."

The Commissioner has certified to the Comptroller that the average annualized percentage increase received was 6.08 percent. Therefore, effective July 1, 1994 all county officials whose salary is determined by Title 8, Chapter 24, Part 1, shall increase 6.08 percent.

(T.C.A. 8-24-112 (a)(1))

This means that the county executive's minimum salary is five percent (5%) greater than the sheriff's actual salary (sheriff's minimum plus supplement, if any).

The County Uniform Highway Law provides that if two or more persons act as the chief administrative officer of the county highway department, the compensation amount above is equally divided between or among them. The county legislative body may set the salary of the chief administrative officer in an amount greater than the minimum salary noted above.
